## Our Goal

Keshet Australia's primary goal is to help nurture, protect and provide a safe environment for GLBTI Jews, both children and adults. We need to do this to keep families together. In the greater Melbourne area, Keshet Australia offers social and cultural events for GLBTI Jews ranging from guest speakers, university social events and Jewish theatre.

Keshet plans to offer support, training, and resources to create a Jewish community that welcomes and affirms GLBTI Jews. Here are some things we're currently working on:

## Parents (Currently Running)

We have started Keshet Parents to help families learn to work with and embrace the hopes and dreams of their GLBTI offspring and to deal with the challenges of being parents of GLBTI children.

## Education (by Pesach 2013)

At Keshet we will be offering educational programs to teach rabbis, educators, youth leaders how to help GLBTI Jewish children with the issues surrounding their sexual orientation.

## Community

Keshet Australia's community focus is on educating the Australian Jewish community about GLBTII Jews; about their needs, issues, desires and strivings as they try to remain part of our Jewish community.

Our main goal is to provide a safe place to discuss some of the particular issues that we as Jewish parents often encounter upon the discovery of our child's sexual orientation.

Our first meeting took place in July and in a relaxed and confidential environment, parents felt free to express their hopes, dreams and concerns for their children. We represent all spectrums of the community and although we have different stories, it was wonderful to be able to share and connect.

Parents affirmed the importance of addressing some of their questions within a Jewish context, especially because in our Jewish world, *nachas* is generally associated with heterosexual relationships, marriage and grandchildren.
